WIXOM - WHERE IT ALL BEGINS

Just outside of Detroit, there's a clean and quietly efficient manufacturing facility that was designed and is operated with one purpose in mind: the building of high quality luxury cars.

This is the Wixom Assembly Plant ... 63 acres and 14 miles of conveyors, lasercontrolled paint procedures, tobot welders, and over 2,600 highly trained, skilled and dedicated workers. All play major roles in what is the only plant in the world producing Lincolns, Marks, and Continentals.

These cars alone and no others. A commitment to building America's finest luxury cars and nothing less.

IN SEARCH OF THE PERFECT PART

Building quality into any car begins before the actual assembly process. Over 8,000 different parts go into the creation of the 1983 Lincolns, Marks, and Continentals.

Wixom plant management and other corporate executives have worked closely with



the suppliers of these parts to further improve the quality of both their product and inspection procedures during and after manufacturing.

This ensures an even more effective screening for quality as Wixom's own. pre-production inspections often recheck and refest samples of these very same parts after they have been delivered

Although state-of-the-art technology, such as lasers, is used in the examination of parts, personal inspection often plays a large role in the gauging of quality.

For instance, sheet metal inspectors depend on only their highly trained eyes to scan incoming body panels that have been oiled first to highlight any possible surface imperfections...for it is the human eye alone which will detect any such flaws in the finished product.

Every day as many as 20 suppliers of parts, components, and materials confer in person or by phone with Wixom's Material Quality Section to discuss the continual inspection and upgrading of their products. It's all part of the ongoing search for quality in the production of automotive components for the 1983 Lincolns, Marks, and Continentals.

PUTTING OUR REPUTATION ON THE LINE

The real keys to quality, however, are the affitudes and actions on the assembly line. This is where diligence and dedication pay off. At Wixom, on-the-line quality control begins with a new spirit, a new pride in workmanship fostered by an employee development and training program and resulting in such employee involvement activities as problem-solving groups, quality circles, and work teams.



It continues with the concept of quality as an ongoing process which is continually monitored and judged in relation to already established standards and specifications. The idea is to make certain that these cars are built right to begin with, rather than trying to make them right or "bring them up to standards" later.

It's the job of specially-trained individuals known as "Quality Upgrade Operators" to assist production supervisors in maintaining quality on the line. In addition, there are 22 Quality Inspection Control Points strategically located throughout the plant. They help alert plant management to potential problems throughout the assembly process.

When one of these Quality Control Points discovers a frequency of imperfections. a revolving blue light is activated to alert all area management to that fact so that the problem can be aulckly corrected.

KEEPING AN EYE ON THE ROBOTS

To err may be human, but Wixom's quality control leaves nothing to chance, even if the subject under analysis is a robot worker instead of a person. Automated or robot units are responsible for the welding of both floor pans and bodysides at Wixom. Close scrutiny is given to their efforts as well



Assembled bodysides are checked daily to make certain that the proper dimensions are maintained in all openings. A similar test is performed on selected, totally assembled sheet metal bodies to ensure that all welded components are precisely where they were engineered to be.

In addition, one unit a week is completely destroyed by an air chisel which is used to tear apart all spot welds and fusion welds to verify that they were properly made.

Before leaving the Body Shop, each complete sheet metal assembly is carefully examined by two inspectors who actually feel the surfaces for dents and dings too minute or subtle to be detected visually on a bare metal surface.

PAINTING WITH ELECTRICITY The assembled body doesn't stay in its bare metal state for long, though, as it undergoes a very thorough body finishing and painting procedure. First, the body is completely cleaned then given a

phosphate bath which actually etches the metal's surface to make the subsequent coat of primer adhere to it more easily.



The entire car body is then dipped into a tank of primer in which electricity is used to affix the primer to the surface. At least two coats are applied (one without electricity), then heat-cured. Selective wet sanding and a thorough drying follow before final painting.

Again, an electrostatic process is used to apply the final coat of acrylic enamel, as each paint particle is positively-charged to adhere more readily to the negatively-charged body surface. Both the lustrous color coat and the protective clearcoat are applied in this manner in a process controlled by computers and employing sophisticated loser technology to ensure a steady, even flow of paint.

The painted body is then inspected, handpolished, sanded and repainted, if necessary, until it meets the inspector's approval. Selected units are also tested for paint adhesion, paint film thickness and gloss. Humidity and salt tests are also conducted in specially built control.

DOOTINS.

After painting, vehicles receive their vinyl tops, moldings, and various interior and exterior trim items which are carefully installed by hand before final assembly on the chassis line, where all subassemblies such as engine, transmission, and suspension meet to complete the vehicle.



THE PRE-DELIVERY ROUTE

After final assembly, each new Lincoln, Mark, and Confinental enters the Pre-Delivery Department where several checks are made for overall quality acceptance. First, the underbody and trim are inspected. Then every unit is subjected to a five-minute water test. This is followed by a test of each vehicle's electrical system using a unique portable, computer-controlled testing device known as a "Unimet". The Unimet helps inspectors pinpoint faults in the car's electrical system accurately and quickly. This is then the "end of the line"... but not the end of the testing.

THE FINAL ANALYSIS

As if all the previous quality checks weren't enough, selected vehicles head immediately to the Audit Building where they are subjected to a critical examination tailored to be as close to customer evaluation as possible.

Any problem areas are noted and assigned a "concern value" designed to reflect the importance or noticeability of a flaw or defect. The cars are thoroughly inspected inside and out for fit, finish, and operational ease of components. Then a comprehensive road test over a variety of surfaces helps determine the functional design integrity of the

entire vehicle.

Flaws and defects, some almost too small to be noticed by the untrained eye are then indicated by stick-on arrows color-coded to indicate the degree of importance. These "marked cars" are eventually displayed in special in-plant evaluation areas which resemble, more than anything else, small scale versions

of actual dealer showrooms . . right down to the carpeting and potted plants.



It is here that both management and workers become closely involved with both the results of the total assembly process and the overall qualify program. They can carefully inspect the cars, examining the specific areas in need of attention and improvement. They can pick up a nearby hotline phone and call in any suggestions they might have for facilitating those improvements. These suggestions are carefully reviewed and often put into effect within 24 to 48 hours after the initial call.

Each night, 22 cars are driven home by inspectors, engineers and managers who complete a thorough on-road analysis and register their comments on a special checklist.

In addition, as cars are awaiting shipment, selected units are given a final review for major defects. This is known as the "Warranty Reduction Audit Program" or W.R.A.P. Inspection for short. It includes a walk-around inspection and a complete electrical test. Any units failing the test are immediately removed from the shipping area and are reviewed daily by plant management.
