THE POWER PACK

Modular power

Since 1991, all Town Cars have been powered by Ford's modular 4.6-liter (281-cubic inch) single overhead-cam V8. This smooth, silky V8 has Ford's EEC-V processor that controls the sequential multipoint electronic fuel injection, electronic voltage regulator, mandatory onboard diagnostics II programming and a distributorless ignition. The engine is offered in two states of tune: 205 bhp or 220 bhp, enabling 0-60-mph sprints in a shade less than eight seconds.
